

### **New York State Quarter Horse Association 2010 Closed Stallion Service Sale and Futurity**

1. Stallion owner donates stallion service to NYSQHA to sell. Services must sell at 60% of advertised stud fee. Services will be accepted starting on October 1<sup>st</sup>; sale will begin on December 1<sup>st</sup> and close on June 30<sup>th</sup>.
2. Stallions will be accepted after the sale begins but advertising will be limited to the NYSQHA web-site and listed in the NYSQHA newsletters.
3. Stallions can be donated as pre-sold provided 60% of stud fee is included with the nomination form. All checks are made payable to NYSQHA.
4. Purchases will be on a first come first serve basis. Full payment of 60% of stud fee must be submitted with bid form. Purchaser of services will be notified. Once a service is sold there will be refunds. All checks made payable to NYSQHA.
5. Stallions standing at private treaty will start at \$300.00 minimum bid.
6. Stallion owner can purchase his own stallion's service.
7. Once a service is sold all foals (AQHA or APHA) sired by that stallion and born in 2011 can be shown in closed futurity with an entry fee of \$50.00 paid by July 1<sup>st</sup>.
  - a. Stallion owner of a sold service receives one free entry in the weanling 2011 futurity.
  - b. If service doesn't well only the stallion owner may enter (2) foals with the entry fee of \$50.00 each. Foal must be out of mare that is owned by the stallion owner at time of breeding.
  - c. All entries (free or paid) must be submitted on entry form and a copy of registration certificate or completed breeder's certificate. Forms need to be completed by July 1<sup>st</sup> to avoid late fee of \$100.00. No entries accepted after August 15<sup>th</sup>.
8. All foals must be nominated in their weanling year even if not showing as a weanling in order to be eligible to show in 2012 as a yearling.
9. NYSQHA will keep 15% of stallion service sale monies and 15% of all entry fees and late fees paid for expenses.
10. Purchaser's mare must be registered with AQHA/APHA or AQHA identified for thoroughbreds. The purchaser is responsible for all expenses incurred during the breeding period as per stallion breeding contract.
11. Owners and exhibitors of all entries must be members of NYSQHA.
12. All monies from the stallion service sale will be retained for the NYSQHA Closed Futurity. The foal nomination fees, and late fees, will be added to the appropriate classes
  - a. If the stallion service sale monies are \$5000.00 or better, \$1000.00 will be moved into the lungeline futurity classes to be split \$500.00 english and \$500.00 western.
  - b. For every increment of \$5000.00 taken in, after the first \$5000.00 has been collected from the stallion service sale, \$500.00 will be added to the lungeline futurities to be split \$250.00 english and \$250.00 western.
  - c. If the stallion proceeds are under \$5000.00 then \$500.00 will be moved to the lungeline futurity classes to be split \$250.00 english and \$250.00 western.

- d. The remainder of the monies will be split 50/50 into weanling and yearling halter classes. It will then be split within the divisions of the classes. Weanlings 50% to colts/geldings and 50% to fillies, yearlings 33% to stallions, 33% to geldings and 33% to fillies.
  - e. All entries fees and late fees will be put in the appropriate class/division with 15% held for expenses with remainder paid out.
13. Pay back will be given to 1<sup>st</sup> thru 6<sup>th</sup> place in each futurity (40%, 25%, 15%, 10%, 5%, and 5%). If 15 or more entries show the payback in the classes will be 1<sup>st</sup> thru 8<sup>th</sup> (30%, 18%, 15%, 11%, 9%, 7%, 5%, and 5%).
- a. All ties will be broken. The Judge from the 1<sup>st</sup> go round will be the tie breaker.
  - b. There will be three go rounds the entry with the most points will be the winner.
  - c. All payouts will be tabulated on the final futurity results day per formulas above.
  - d. Any horse getting away from handler, entering with the wrong number, or not compliant with AQHA rules for the class will be disqualified.
14. Announcement of the stallion whose get earns the most points in our newsletter as follows.
- High Point Halter Sire and Reserve High Point Halter Sire
  - High Point Performance Sire and Reserve High Point performance Sire
15. Futurity points will be given to horses exhibited at the NYSQHA Futurity based on placing. All horses will be placed in each go round. Horses in classes of any number will be placed accordingly; say 10 show then 10 points to 1<sup>st</sup> place, 9 points to 2<sup>nd</sup> place down to 1 point for 10<sup>th</sup> place. Horses that are disqualified will not receive any points but their entry will count for total points.
16. The NYSQHA Closed Futurity shall consist of two divisions to be shown in 7 classes.
- a. Weanling Division
    - 1. Colt/Gelding Halter class
    - 2. Filly Halter Class
  - b. Yearling Division
    - 1. Stallion Halter Class
    - 2. Gelding Halter Class
    - 3. Mare Halter Class
  - c. Yearling Lungeline
    - 1. English
    - 2. Western
17. An Award will be given to the high point NYS bred/foaled/owned/exhibited weanling only for the colt/gelding and filly classes.
- a. Stallion owner(s) must reside in NYS.
  - b. Mare owner(s) must reside in NYS.
  - c. Mare must be bred and foaled in NYS.
  - d. Foal owner must reside in NYS.

- e. A completed application for registration (copy) must be provided (even if foal is registered) to have foal eligible for this award.
  - f. Any entry may be verified with AQHA/APHA for actual breeding and foaling status.
  - g. A copy of the mares (Dams) registration Certificate must be submitted with foal entry.
18. A stallion incentive will be awarded to stallion owners of the final futurity winners. These monies would be appropriated at a rate of 10% of the total purse won by any offspring of said sire. If there is more than one foal shown by said sire the purse would be accumulative.
19. All papers will be verified. Horses that do not provide a copy of above documentation by August 15<sup>th</sup> will not be allowed to show. NO EXCEPTIONS.
20. All entries must show under all three judges to be eligible for awards. First place winners will receive a trophy; second through 6<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> will receive a ribbon or trophy.
- a. Checks will be mailed within 10 days of the futurity to all entries that placed per rule #15.
21. The same exhibitor must show the horse under all three go rounds of the NYSQHA Closed Futurity.
22. Lungeline classes will be judged based on NSBA rules and guidelines.
23. Sole responsibility for making the payments on time lies with the entrant.
24. All owners and exhibitors in electing to enter the NYSQHA Closed Futurity agree as a condition of entry to allow drug testing of their horse. Refusal of a drug test or a positive result will cause automatic disqualification of their horse and forfeiture of all awards.
- a. In the weanling division the payment schedule is as follows:
    - 1. Nomination fee of \$50.00 is payable by July 1<sup>st</sup> of weanling year.
    - 2. After July 1<sup>st</sup> a late fee of \$100.00 will be added to the nomination fee. This will be accepted until August 15<sup>th</sup> after that the class is closed.
    - 3. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER AUGUST 15<sup>TH</sup>.
    - 4. All weanlings must be entered in order to show as a yearling.
  - b. In the yearling division the payment schedule is as follows:
    - 1. Yearling must have been nominated in their weanling year whether free or paid no exceptions.
    - 2. A payment of \$50.00 for each class in which the horse is to participate (Halter and/or lungeline) is due by July 1<sup>st</sup>.
    - 3. After July 1<sup>st</sup> a late fee of \$100.00 is added to the nomination fee per class and will be accepted until August 15<sup>th</sup> after that the classes are closed.
    - 4. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER AUGUST 15<sup>TH</sup>.
25. Once an entry has been accepted---No Refunds--- will be issued.
26. The NYSQHA Board of directors shall resolve any dispute which might arise, not covered in these rules. Any hardship cases will be judged individually by the NYSQHA board of directors.
